School Mission Statement

MS 319 offers a small learning environment where students receive personal attention from all staff members. We provide our students with a nurturing small middle school environment. Principal's Statement

MS 319 opened its doors in 2004 as a small, progressive middle school with a rigorous curriculum, a strong community of families, teachers and staff, who share a vision for the school. At MS 319, we have teams of teachers who meet regularly to discuss and evaluate their students. This type of consistent teacher collaboration will ensure that our students receive the best possible education and attention. Our school has a strong focus on technology, and teachers, as well as, students are held to high standards of performance.

Special Academic Programs

MS 319 offers a variety of academic programs in addition to the mandated state and city curriculum. Students in need of additional support receive AIS with a maximum student-teacher ratio of 7:1. During AIS time students may receive support in mathematics, science, or ESL. Our school also offers an Advisory Program with a student.

Extracurricular Activities

At MS 319 we offer a variety of enrichment programs. The students begin two mornings a week participating in one of our many programs such as, dance, Capoeira, restaurant management, women in sports, stock market club, engineering club, chess, yearbook, soccer and Spanish regents preparation.

Community Support

The MS 319 community is made up of families, teachers, staff and community organizations. Some of our partners in the community include: Children's Aid Society, NY Cares, Computers for Youth, Merrill Lynch, Trout in the Classroom, Kaplan Accelerated Reading and Math (Renaissance), ExC ELL (Vocabulary instruction for English Language Learners)






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




