School Mission Statement

The Institute for Collaborative Education (I.C.E.) offers a student-centered education for 6th-12th graders in New York City. Organized around the 10 Principles of the Coalition of Essential Schools (essentialschools.org), I.C.E. engages faculty, students, parents, and the community to build a culture of lifelong learners. Using rigorous custom-designed curriculum we challenge students and prepare them for college. Our graduation requirements surpass the state standards and require that students develop a portfolio of their best work. Our graduates are prepared for college, graduate school, and the professional world through the college preview program and senior executive internship program offered at our school. Through our nurturing small school environment, students are encouraged: to appreciate the importance of their ideas; to develop their Habits of Mind; and to respect and to be tolerance of multiple viewpoints and perspectives in our world.

Principal's Statement

I.C.E. is a small, public, Middle School/High School devoted to the pursuit of academic excellence. Collaborations with local universities, colleges, public and private organizations, provide students with opportunities for integrating college courses, internships, and community service into their studies. An extensive after-school program exposes students to additional cultural/artistic, educational, athletic, and academic activities. In our multicultural learning environment, we educate with the philosophy that all students who desire success can achieve it.

Special Academic Programs

Math Workshop support classes are provided for middle school students; 7 year science program with advanced electives in such as Disease Theory and Environmental Science; Multimedia technology throughout the curriculum; visual Art courses; Music instrument and band courses, honors electives in Law and Civics (Politics)






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




