School Mission Statement

Our school stands as an alternative to other schools with high caliber academic programs, with its devotion to collaborative process, pluralism, and compassion, combined with academic rigor. Our program features advanced courses in English literature, art, calculus, statistics, physics, feminism, sociology, human rights, chemistry and biology.

Model UN, debate, art, drama, chorus, video, dance, newspaper, social action, literary magazine, math magazine, student government. Cultural clubs are signature to Lab--Asian Cultural Club, Black Alliance, and Gay/Straight Alliance. Sports include basketball, baseball, cheerleading, volleyball, soccer, golf, track.

We have active partnerships with a variety of cultural and educational institutions including Hunter College, Columbia University's Teachers College, MoMA, The Highline Project, The New School, New York University, the Museum of Natural History, Project Renewal, and Student Press Initiatives.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




