#### School Mission Statement

*The mission of Eleanor Roosevelt High School is to create an academically challenging high school providing all students with a rich and comprehensive liberal arts education, an education which will enable them to make decisions in the world, to initiate and negotiate change, and to be life-long learners. Through the cooperative efforts of our staff, parents, students and members of the Upper East Side Community, it is our goal to provide a stimulating educational environment with enough support from the academic community to provide students with the tools necessary to manage their lives with courage and purpose; to have a range of options for the future; to have the confidence to be creative and self-sufficient while being able to work collaboratively and maintaining an appreciation of the world. Our mission is to teach students to think and communicate with depth, clarity, and expression; to foster the joy of discovery; to value questions as much as answers.*

#### Principal's Statement

We started this school in 2002 with 105 9th graders and currently have 480 students in grades 9 through 12. The school is designed to be an academically rigorous place where students are taught to think deeply; to develop their ability to question; to use technology fluently in a variety of ways; to incorporate the arts in their examination of the world; to find something which they can feel passionate about and to develop the skills that will allow them to pursue that passion and make it central to their lives.

#### Special Academic Programs

Students have a choice of arts electives. We offer Advanced Placement courses as well as college courses. As a relatively new school, our curriculum is evolving and is responsive to the needs and strengths of our students. Our program includes a strong academic advisory program designed to optimize student success.

#### Extracurricular Activities

We offer an array of after school activities, from Film Making to Chess, from Latin Dancing to Newspaper, from Rock Band to Jazz to Ceramics. We have PSAL men's and women's basketball, soccer, tennis and track. Our Debate Team, Science Team and Law Team have won competitions. Peer tutoring and academic support are available in all subjects.

#### Community Support

We have a grant from the Manhattan Chamber of Commerce to support our College and Career Office. This year, our Digital Photography class is working with the Kiboko Project through a pair of arts grants. Students can earn college credit through St. John's University and Hunter College.

#### Parent/School Support

Our parent's association is extremely supportive. They have sponsored school dances, international dinners and SAT prep courses. Our school auctions and street fair have been hugely successful.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




