School Mission Statement

Millennium High School (MHS) provides a rigorous liberal arts academic program in an assets-based environment in partnership with the YMCA of Greater New York. MHS prepares graduates for college and provides supports for students to set and reach their goals. Millennium High School believes in teacher leadership and provides an extensive professional development program focused on content, pedagogy, and youth development / advisement.

Principal's Statement

Millennium High School is a college preparatory program and students are required to take a full schedule every year and must complete four years of math, science, history, and English to graduate. Students are expected to complete 25 books each year and commit to 20 hours of community service.

The school is physically located on the 11th, 12th, and 13th floors of an office building and the construction was paid for by money raised through downtown community advocates and foundations.

Special Academic Programs

Students take a core set of classes in grades 9/10 including an extensive reading and writing program (10 pds a week) and a simultaneous Biology / Chemistry sequence for two years. In grades 11/12 students select their courses and can enroll in Advanced Placement classes at the school or enroll in college classes at local universities as well.

Extracurricular Activities

YMCA of Greater NY coordinates the afterschool program including: sports (PSAL and club), tutoring, music, painting and photography, student gov. clubs, and school newspaper. All activities are based on student interest. Any group of students (7-10 people) that submits a proposal receives an adult sponsor to supervise the activity.

Community Support

In addition to the YMCA of Greater NY, there is a Friends of Millennium High School board that includes downtown businesses and financial institutions. The Friends of Millennium High School helps fundraise for school programs, sponsors internships, supports college scholarships, and provides mentors.

Parent/School Support

The Parent's Association sponsors several annual fundraisers each year as well as several school - wide community events (including Diversity Day and Health and Wellness Day). There are also quarterly workshops geared to college admissions, teen communication, and other parent interests.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




