School Mission Statement

Ballet Tech, The New York City Public School for Dance is a collaborative between the New York City Department of Education and The Ballet Tech Foundation. It is a performing arts school for students in grades 4-12. Admission is by audition for any pupil who is a New York City resident. There is a strong emphasis on college preparatory instruction and classical ballet. All students are required to take the Regents and other New York State/City exams. The school provides a small, caring learning community where students are not only nurtured, but challenged, both academically and artistically. Parent involvement is encouraged.

The primary goal is to challenge the pupil to reach his/her potential and to become well-informed citizens.

There are a variety of after school programs to support students who need help academically.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




