We now call ourselves REPERTORY COMPANY HIGH SCHOOL for THEATRE ARTS and serve a population from grades 9-12. We have redesigned our school to be more focused on theatre arts. Our Students are asked to challenge themselves fully, try new things and dare to experiment in order to learn more about themselves as actors and as people. We encourage the motto: "Life isn't about finding yourself. Life is about creating yourself."

Special Academic Programs

At Repertory High School students follow a four year theatre arts sequence and full academic core curriculum. Our theatre arts classes include drama, acting, classical theatre, dance movement, music, vocal technique, stage management, stage craft and production lab. Students have the opportunity to participate in school wide productions.

Extracurricular Activities

We offer a full variety of productions that we produce drama festivals, talent showcases, dance concerts, poetry slams, fashion shows, musical productions and dramatic plays. All students are allowed to participate in these productions. We also have opportunities to work with professional theatre groups that develop projects with our school.

Community Support

The International Trademark Association (INTA) is our corporate sponsor who supports a tutoring program, SAT prep class, and library books. We have an on going partnership with the Roundabout Theatre company. We also have AMAS Musical Theatre Academy at our school on Saturdays. We also participate the technical theatre program with Town Hall.

We have established a School Leadership Team and active Parents Association that meets to discuss issues and concerns. Our parents participate in planning and producing our productions. We also established a parent book and theatre club. We have developed parent workshops in dance, yoga and drama.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




