#### School Mission Statement

*The mission of A. Philip Randolph High School is to graduate students who possess the academic, social, and technological skills to attend the college of their choice and live successful lives. Our entire school community is committed to providing our students with a supportive climate where parents and educators engage students to exceed their own expectations. Within this environment, students will be able to achieve personal success while making enduring contributions to the world.*

*A. Philip Randolph offers four extremely competitive programs. Our engineering, medical, and humanities academies are fully screened. Student must demonstrate an overall GPA of 85 or better, 90% attendance or better, and minimum NYS Standards Level of III in both ELA and Math exams. Our students are expected to take on challenging course work that exceeds NYS standards and prepares them for college.*

#### Principal's Statement

A. Philip Randolph offers a rigorous college preparatory curriculum which prepares students to succeed in college and in the fields of science, engineering, and the humanities. This year, over 90% of our graduates plan to attend college and were awarded over three million dollars in scholarships and financial awards. Our daily attendance is 90% or better. Our students take Advanced Placement courses and/or College Now courses at Randolph or City College CUNY to earn up to 15 college credits. In recognition of our commitment and achievements, Randolph was the winner of the 2000 Inspiration Award from The College Board.

#### Special Academic Programs

All A. Philip Randolph students are expected to graduate with advanced regents diplomas. To insure academic achievement, all students participate in enrichment programs and a nine period school day. NASA, STEM, Upward Bound, SAT Prep, Settlement College Prep, Sound Business Inc., Gateway Medical, and College Now are only some example.

#### Extracurricular Activities

Extracurricular activities include the Debate Team, Big Sibs, Peer Mediators, Brotherhood, Sisterhood, Arista, the School Newspaper, Poetry, French, Spanish, Cheerleading, Dance, Music, Drama, Christian, and Percussion clubs. PSAL sports include Baseball, Basketball, Bowling, Lacrosse, Soccer, Softball, Swimming, Tennis, Track, and Volleyball team

#### Community Support

Our Partnerships include: Sound Business Inc., City College Grove School of Engineering, Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education, Mt. 



## TEACHERS


Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




