Principal's Statement

Founded in 1992 as a language transition program serving newly-arrived Spanish-speaking students, in June 2001 our school became an articulated diploma-granting high school. Because of its location our school plays an unusual role in the life of the community. We are dedicated to helping both the students and their parents make the transition to living in a new country. Parent. As part of our mission to fostering a community of life-long learners, we have offered computer training to parents in addition to the after school and Saturday programs in academic subjects we offer to students.

Special Academic Programs

We offer Advanced Placement classes in Spanish, Spanish Literature, Music and biology. We participate in the College Now program with The City College of NY; we provide extensive after school/Saturday classes in: Science, Mathematics, English, and Social Studies, and Regents Exam preparation in these subject areas.

Extracurricular Activities

The following are students' organizations: AMAS, STUDENT COUNCIL, JOURNALISM, STUDENT GOVERNMENT, etc. The students benefit for the following activities: Base Grant for HIV/AIDS Awareness; Yoga, Karate, Drama, Video Production and Peer Mediation Workshops.

Community Support

We have been able to provide a variety of programs and services for our parents and students via our partnerships with the Washington-Heights Inwood Coalition, Ucan, Dominicans 2000, El Centro para el Desarrollo de la Mujer Dominicana, The Leadership Academy and Working Playground.

Parental involvement plays an exceptionally important and vital role in our school. The average attendance at monthly PA meetings is 60. Open school events generally draw at least 240 parents. The SLT draws full and regular attendance by parent members. And, the Family Day brings together hundreds of people once a year from 1:00 - 9:00 pm.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




