School Mission Statement

Principal's Statement

Central Park East High School (CPEHS) is a grade 9 to 12 school. The fundamental aim of CPEHS is to teach students to use their minds well - to prepare them for lives that are productive, socially useful and personally satisfying. The school's academic program stresses intellectual achievement. At CPEHS, students learn to explore, experiment, discover, and connect what they learn in the classroom with the real world through cooperative learning, group activities and Accountable Talk. All students at CPEHS are required to satisfy all New York state and city graduation requirements.

Special Academic Programs

At CPEHS, we use these academic programs to support our students' learning: Ramp Up to Literacy, 90 minute block classes with the "workshop model" of instruction, double lab periods, regents prep classes, advisory, independent reading and the NY State 25 book standard. All classes are aligned with and support NY State standards.

Extracurricular Activities

PSAL Varsity and JV basketball, PSAL volleyball, PSAL football, Project Arts drama program, Student Government, Girls Inc., the East Harlem Tutorial Program, and the Brotherhood / Sister Sol, Mt. Sinai internships and Center for the Arts Internships.

CPEHS works closely with the following: East Harlem Tutorial Program, Mt. Sinai Adolescent Health Center, The Ackerman Institute for Family Therapy.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




