School Mission Statement

The High School of Art and Design is the only school of its kind in New York City: it is a school designed to develop the talents and vision of artists. A&D is a community of creativity that raises the bar for success in academics and design.

We seek artists interested in architecture and the commercial arts. Design classes are conducted as professional studios. We develop a sense of self as artists and engender the most nurturing environment for growth. Rigorous standards in the arts and academic subjects afford our students tremendous success in post-secondary education. Our students learn to take pride in their talents and those of others through the many exhibits through which we showcase our students' accomplishments.

Principal's Statement

Art and Design, in addition to offering a rigorous Regents based academic program features majors in commercial arts and architecture that prepare students for post-secondary education and professions in industry. We are continuously redesigning our courses of study to meet the evolving demands of 21st Century industry, moving toward more computer-aided programs. Students are admitted by a highly competitive entrance examination in art and portfolio evaluation. Since all of our art teachers have worked in industry, they maintain affiliations with artists and institutions which allow our students exposure to "real" experiences in the arts.

Special Academic Programs

Includes interdisciplinary projects in the arts and academic areas. We have a Tenth Year Humanities Block (English, S.S., Art & AP Art History). We also offer Advanced Placement Calculus, English Lit/Comp, US History, World History, English Lang.& Composition, pre-calculus, tutoring sessions, and study groups of math and science.

Extracurricular Activities

During the 2006-07 school year, activities include: newspaper, yearbook, male & female basketball, fencing, baseball, softball, soccer, bowling & volleyball, PSAL teams, Annual Spring Arts Festival, Gallery Exhibitions, after school tutoring, Mentoring, LEARN, S.V.A. Liberty Partnership, Center for Arts Ed. Internship.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




