Our children have classes provided by full time cluster teachers in the areas of art, science, computers, library science, and physical education, and Reading Reform. Monthly writing celebrations, Hats on for Reading Day, 100th Day Celebration, and Boys' Night Out help to enhance our program.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




