We believe all children are able to learn and that we as adults must all support each student's quest for knowledge and fulfillment. We concentrate on improving Standards based reading and mathematics skills through the various curriculum areas. We continually encourage our many non-English-speaking students to learn English while maintaining their native language skills.

Principal's Statement

P.S. 135Q is a multicultural, barrier free building with approximately 1200 students. The school has a Principal, 3 assistant principals, 2 Literacy and 2 Math coaches, 3 secretaries, a guidance counselor, a health coordinator, approximately 85 teachers, a parent coordinator, a family worker, 25 paras, 2 full time physical therapists, 2 full time occupational therapists, 2 nurses, 5 aides and a support staff of 20. This K-5 school has heterogeneous grouping in grades K-5 except for the gifted classes on each grade. We have CTT and Dual Language classes on most grades. Approximately 50 physically challenged students are mainstreamed on all grades.

Special Academic Programs

Gifted classes, Peer Tutoring, Parent Volunteer Tutoring, CTT & Dual Language Classes. Teacher Specialists in ESL, music, art, science, mathematics, social studies, health and physical education and computer education, English as a Second Dialect program for English Speaking students new to the United States.

Extracurricular Activities

Early morning phonics and reading, Chorus, Band, Peer Tutoring, Sunrise tutoring, Haitian Club, Computer Club, ESL/Science, Project Sunset Extended day test preparation, Saturday ESL program. English as a Second Language for adults program for parents.

Community Support

We have continuing partnerships with North Fork Bank, Central Queens YMCA, Scholastic Book Clubs and various Veteran's Groups. We are continuing to expand our partnership with York College of CUNY.

Parent/School Support

Parent workshops were held in Sept. to familiarize parents with the new curriculum initiatives. Other workshops are conducted for test preparation, Learning Leaders and various curriculum areas. The PTA and school conduct joint meetings for student performances and Author of the Month awards. Parent Patrol Volunteers for arrival and dismissal.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




