School Mission Statement

JHS 189's mission is to create a caring learning environment where all students are provided with the skills to achieve higher standards of literacy and apply mathematical analysis in all curriculum areas. We further aim to give students the opportunities to engage in arts experiences wherever possible, as well as display information in multiple modalities (text, pictorial, sound) and participate in citizenship learning activities in order to prepare them to live and be productive members of a multicultural/multilingual society. Moreover, we aspire to meet the individual needs of our English language learners, many newly arrived in the United States, and growing numbers of special education students as they are reintegrated in their neighborhood school. These educational endeavors will enable all of our students to understand "what was," appreciate "what is" and envision "what can be."

Principal's Statement

We offer a standard bearing citywide curriculum. We welcome students from over sixty countries who participate in a rich English as a Second Language program; our Chinese speaking students are enrolled in a bilingual program. Saturday Academy and test preparatory classes help students to prepare for the standardized examinations, to enhance their study skills and to receive academic intervention services. Among our unique programs are American Sign Language and Korean as a foreign language. Students are given the opportunity to participate in chorus, a fine arts program, including digital arts, or a computer program.

Special Academic Programs

Accelerated English, Living Environment, Math A, music and art are offered. SPE Sholars Program, American Sign Language, Econo Bowl, Mathcounts, Spanish and Project Arts including Digital Arts are available. Math A Regents and Science Regents are given.

Extracurricular Activities

Arista Peer Tutoring, Math Club, Extended Day Tutoring and Mentoring. Extended Day Reading and Math and Test Prep. Ballroom dancing, school basketball team, cheerleading, chess club, Hip-Hop dancing, Country Western Line dancing, a Mouse Squad and Tai Chi.

Community Support

We partner with Beacon YMCA which offers comprehensive activities, for families days, evenings and weekends. The LaGuardia C.C./Q.U.P. "Gear Up" program, with Flushing Public Library offers opportunities to support students, staff and parents. Chinese Language/culture school adds to JHS 189. Our Digital Arts program is held at Flushing Town Hall.

Parent/School Support

Parents serve on the SLT and assist with health checks, orientation, trips, G.O. activities and gym programs. Adult ESL and a variety of supportive family courses are offered by the school, Beacon YMCA and Dept of Ed year round, around the clock. The parent coordinator holds monthly workshops on a variety of topics of interest to parents.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




