#### School Mission Statement

#### Principal's Statement

Opened in 2004-5, Channel View School for Research is a small, 6-12th grade school dedicated to the belief that all students can learn, and it is the school's responsibility to provide the necessary support for this to happen. We set high standards for all our students and help them meet these standards by providing personal attention, a safe and respectful environment, a strong sense of community, and curricula that is both challenging and engaging. Students, staff, families and community members all see themselves as part of a team whose main goal is the success of every student.

#### Special Academic Programs

CVSR offers middle school students accelerated classes and high school students advanced placement courses beginning in the 10th grade.

Performance-based assessment, block programming, Art & Music program, interdisciplinary curriculum, service learning/internship program, 3-to-1 computer to student ratio.

#### Extracurricular Activities

Intramural basketball, double Dutch, Road Runners Track, Chorus, Poetry, Multi-Cultural, Peer mediation, Newspaper, Yearbook, Peer Tutoring Clubs, and Student Government. 


Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School
