Special Academic Programs

This school's special academic programs include a rigorous partnership with CUNY York College, where students take college level courses at our school taught by college professors. We also have an "Achieve Now" evening school program addressing our most needy students with limited credits and attendance problems.

Extracurricular Activities

Our activities include: cheerleading, The Young Men and Women's Leadership Group and key clubs. We also have football, baseball, soccer, men and women's basketball, track, & volleyball teams. Formal peer mediation and conflict resolution programs were also made available to students.

Community Support

Through our PCEC we have multiple community contacts including: New Visions for Public Schools, the YMCA, Community Mediation, Queens Child Guidance, The National Conference of Negro Women, St. Albans Multipurpose Center, etc. Each of them offers varied opportunities for students/parents/staff.

Parent/School Support

We have an active PTA & school leadership team & are the only school in the City of NY that has a Parent and Community Exchange Center (PCEC). We have a full-time Parent Coordinator who is a liaison for parents and builds partnerships with community based organizations, college affiliations, & relationships with elected officials.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




