Successful competitions in Math, Science, Computer Programming, Music and Art, sports, and mock trial bring awards to students and recognition to the school. Many students continue their education in the most challenging colleges and universities.

Special Academic Programs

Students in the S.M.A.R.T. program conduct research in Math and Science or study Humanities. Honors & Advanced Placement classes are also available in more than eight subject areas. Law classes stimulate debate and critical thinking. The Music Institute & Art Academy accept talented students to an intensive 4 year course of study.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




