### School Mission Statement

*Wagner is a small school enrolling students in grades 7 through 12. As students mature, we expect them to take increasing responsibility for their academic, social and communal accomplishments. The academic program is student-centered and rigorous, moving students towards a Regents diploma and post-secondary education. Students receive individual attention from their community group teachers, guidance counselors, administrators and classroom teachers. We believe arts and technology inspire our students towards creative expression and active engagement with their studies. As a faculty we strive to improve our practice, understand our students' needs and passions, and make Wagner a second home to all members of our community.*

### Principal's Statement

As part of a group of campus high schools at LaGuardia Community College, students participate in a variety of college opportunities, such as use of college facilities, free College Connection and College Now classes, and Upward Bound. Partnerships with cultural institutions increase opportunities for careers in various fields. All students take a semester-long internship and career preparation curricula to help them make wise decisions for their future. Most of our graduates continue their formal education. Our Panther sports teams combine students from Wagner, Middle College and International High Schools.

### Special Academic Programs

ASHP in the junior year combines history, literature and art. College classes are given in psychology, literature, geography and mathematics. Interactive Mathematics Program teaches higher level concepts. Recovery classes permit students to re-learn course content.



## TEACHERS


Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




