School Mission Statement

The school will provide students with a challenging curriculum preparing them for college or a chosen profession. The students will be provided with a safe learning environment in which their academic, social, emotional and physical needs are met. They will become good citizens and advocates for upholding the law. Students will have a greater understanding of the law, our judicial system, civil and first amendment rights. They will become advocates for their community, and work to develop civic strategies to decrease crime as they learn how it affects every member of their community. Students will also be provided with opportunities through job shadowing, guest speakers, and internships to explore careers in public safety. Their experiences will include working with the NYPD and FDNY, Emergency Medical Services, Forensic Laboratories, Medical Examiners' Office, and hospitals.

Principal's Statement

The instructional program has been configured into two smaller learning communities, each with a dedicated staff. Each learning community will have approximately 350 students. Instructional staff will be provided with professional development in the use of extended time strategies that immerse students in the learning process. Literacy in letters, numbers and technology will be addressed through various teaching techniques to fit a range of learning modalities. Founded in collaboration with NYPD, FDNY and NYC PAL, our school will provide students with opportunities within the various worlds of law enforcement and public safety.

Special Academic Programs

Instruction is organized to support critical thinking, scientific investigation and prepare students for careers in local, state and national law enforcement focusing on career preparation and college selection. Introduction to Law Enforcement, Criminology, Constitutional Law, Science & Public Safety, Forensics, Anatomy, EMS, Seminar, Internship.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




