#### School Mission Statement

*The mission of College of Staten Island High School for International Studies (CSIHSIS) is to provide a nurturing educational environment in which students are actively engaged in developing literacy and problem solving skills to succeed in post secondary education. At CSIHSIS students, staff and parents collaborate to create a vibrant learning community. CSIHSIS students complete a rigorous liberal arts academic program including four years of second language study. CSIHSIS prepares graduates for college and provides supports for students to set and reach their goals.*

The integration of a thorough course of study coupled with community involvement provides students with the skills and experiences to be responsible and ethical participants in a global*

#### Principal's Statement

CSIHSIS, a partnership between Asia Society and CSI, is a college preparatory program. Students complete NYC graduation requirements, 4 years of second language study, 120 hours of service learning, a yearly portfolio and an internship. Students take college courses, courses collaboratively taught by professors and teachers, travel internationally, and become proficient thinkers and users of technology. CSIHS graduates are problem solvers, collaborative team members, have perspectives consciousness, state of the planet and cross-cultural awareness, knowledge of global dynamics and an awareness of human choices enabling them to be global citizens.

#### Special Academic Programs

AP European & US History; Two year Biology/Chemistry sequence; College Now; Architecture, Construction & Engineering Program; & Homework Center. Advisory focused on team and community building, service learning, study skills, end of year portfolio presentations, and preparation for student led conferences. Summer travel, study & intern programs.

CSIHSIS students blog with students around the world as they report for the award winning International Insider. They participate in Model United Nations, international travel (Italy and China this year), International Film Club, robotics, digital photography, Drama Club, Girls Learn International, yoga, student gov't, PSAL sports, tutoring & more!

Partnered with Asia Society and College of Staten Island, as a recipient of a Gates Grant, CSIHSIS is actively involved in the local and global communities through our many partnerships with diverse organizations including UN/USA, iEARN, Net Aid, the JCC, the Architecture, Construction & Engineering Program, and the Brooklyn Home for Aged Men.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**
