School Mission Statement

We, therefore, hold in the highest regard the initiative, innovation, planning, effort and teamwork that result in academic rigor, in standard setting student performance and in continuous improvement.

Principal's Statement

Two years ago Concord High School was removed from the State's SURR list. This year, it was removed from the State's list of schools needing improvement (SINI). According to the State Education Department, we are considered a school 'in good standing' and we are becoming a 'school of excellence.'

For example, our students had a 93% passing percentage on last year's Math Regents and every student except one passed the January 2007 Regents!

Special Academic Programs

All students receive an Apple I-book laptop that is used in a wireless school environment. Partnerships with St. Johns University, Wagner College and College of Staten Island offer college courses and enrichment. Arts courses we offer include: Culinary Arts, Graphic Arts and Media Arts and Production. Honors courses are Law, Genetics and English.

Extracurricular Activities

Concord High School's extracurricular activities include an active Student Government, Leadership team and Student Ambassador Program. Clubs include Bowling, Basketball, Handball, Dance, Drama, Poetry, Yearbook, Scrapbooking, Chess and more. Business and corporate internships are also available.

Community Support

Concord High School's community support includes The Discovery Institute at the College of Staten Island, Wagner College, St. John's University, a range of cultural centers and businesses, and United Activities Unlimited which is a program that offers Student internships that strengthen the connection between young adults and senior citizens.

Parent/School Support

Concord High School collaborates with parents and guardians through ongoing family involvement programs, support groups, a very active PTA and School Leadership Team activities. The school's parent coordinator addresses parental concerns on a daily basis and we offer classes and workshops at our school and at St. John's University.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




