Teachers within our school are involved with the same group of students throughout their middle school years.

Special Academic Programs

Special Academic programs include: Honors Program which includes Regents classes and preparation program for specialized high schools; ESL/Bilingual Program. Our new Lap Top Program accommodates approximately 15 classes and will be expanded. Our academic partnerships include the Bronx River Alliance, Bronx D.A.'s Office and Junior Achievement.

Extracurricular Activities

Activities include: Debate Team, Art Club, Robotic Club Newspaper, Norwood Action Club (a civic club), Environment Club and Chess Club as part of our new participation in Chess in the Schools. Also, basketball, softball and volleyball teams.

We have partnerships with Mosholu Preservation Corporation, Mosholu Woodlawn South Community Coalition, Mosholu-Montefiore Community Center (sponsors of our Beacon Program) and the Norwood News, Cornell and Fordham Universities. We also work closely with the Ralph Lauren Company.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




