Principal's Statement

P.S. 83 is a K-8 school "on the move" in the Morris Park section of the Bronx. We have an excellent staff that serves 1600 students. A balanced literacy program is delivered in a daily literacy block in all classrooms. A math block is also the mode of delivery for our city-wide curriculum. Intensive Academic Intervention Services are provided to all children performing below grade level on a daily basis, as well as enrichment programs for those students performing above grade level. At P.S. 83 we also have a modern "State of the Art" Computer Lab, Science Laboratory, and are designing our new Library/ Media Center for our Middle School.

Special Academic Programs

Project Arts, English as a Second Language, Everyday Math, Math Steps, Impact Math, AUSSIE Balanced Literacy Program, Destination Math, Science Initiative, Foundations and Wilson Reading Programs. Literacy Thru the Arts Programs include Poetry Slams, Talent Shows, and Classical and Broadway productions as culminating events for school community.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




