### Principal's Statement

P.S. 90 is an innovative school whose goals are: -To provide a safe, nurturing, learning environment for our students; -To increase our students performance on all state exams; - To provide opportunities for our teachers to continue to improve their craft.  
Accomplishments: 1) We established a 4th grade academy, in which half of the teachers teach Mathematics and Science; while their colleagues teach Literacy, and Social Studies; 2) Our "Lead Teachers Model" places the lead teacher in the classroom with a "less experienced teacher" rather than having two lead teachers in the same class. Other principals have copied both innovations.

### Special Academic Programs

Our special academic programs include: Reading Recovery, Dual Language, ESL, Visual Art, Bilingual (Spanish), Science Inquiry. Our fourth grade students receive instruction in music and dance. (Phys Ed classes-jump rope.) We utilize Wilson and Leap Frog programs for Academic Intervention.

### Extracurricular Activities

CAB provides basketball, step, dance and visual art classes. During the Spring-Project CARE supports-Fencing and music instruction on the steel drum. Students also play intramural softball.

### Community Support

Our partners: Lehman College, Citizens Advice Bureau, Boy Scouts and Bank Street College.  
Morris Heights Health Center has a clinic in our school.

### Parent/School Support

-We have an active Parents Association. We host EPIC classes to assist parents in working with their children at home (social and academic skills).  
-We provide ESL and Literacy classes for our parents.  
-We host "Family Nights". Our parents provide translation services in Spanish, Bengali and French.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




