School Mission Statement

Our mission is to make students aware of the connections between the growth demanded of a rigorous curriculum and the disciplined work and rewards of the performing arts. By engaging students to manage their learning while developing the skills needed for performance, students will become better learners and develop socialized intelligence that will allow students to actively use their knowledge.

Principal's Statement

Academics will be infused with a Balanced Literacy approach. Academic areas will be driven by vocabulary development, the development of reading fluency, critical thinking, fuller expression in written work and analogous and inferential thinking. The main emphasis will be moving students from their current reading and writing levels to being proficient readers and writers.

Special Academic Programs

Pedagogical approaches will shift from teacher centered to student centered learning. This shift in methodology will allow students to become active learners.

Extracurricular Activities

Students will be exposed to each art form. During the 9th grade students will complete two terms of dance. During the 10th grade students will begin their exploration of music, art and drama.

Community Support

The partnership will support and facilitate the incorporation of the core practices in the academic subjects and the arts. These practices will infuse core knowledge of the academics and the creative process into performances.

Parent Association and School leadership team meet once per month. Parents are invited to all school performance and to be part of the school community.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School
