Our rigorous academic program with hands-on learning will prepare students to meet the standards and regents exam requirements for graduation. Students participate in campus sports, clubs, and a variety of student-centered programs. After-school study programs are provided to help students achieve their potential and goals.

Special Academic Programs

Point of Entry including small and large group interactive learning as well as experiential (hands-on) learning highlights classroom instruction. Tutoring is available during the school day and after-school. PSAT/SAT, Regents preparation, and Advanced Placement exam preparation is offered. A computer lab is available for research.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School
