School Mission Statement

Walton High School's mission is to assist all students in achieving their greatest potential in a challenging and supportive environment. Our goal is to insure that all our students graduate before Walton High School's final phase out year, the 2007-2008 academic school year, is completed. In order to achieve our goal, Walton High School is dedicated to providing all students (including English Language Learners and Special Education students) with an appropriately challenging course of study, which will prepare them to continue their education as lifelong learners, and opportunities for rapid credit accumulation to support timely graduation for all students. Our administration, faculty, and support staff are committed to students' development of inquiry and critical thinking skills around an academically rigorous curriculum and to supporting overall student achievement towards graduation.

Principal's Statement

Students participate in one of five academic and interest based programs, designed to achieve the school's mission and goal. To these ends, Walton High School offers specialized programs such as two International Virtual Enterprise classes, Advanced Placement and Honors Programs, and the Bilingual/ESL Program to speed English language acquisition skills. Career Education is provided for our Special Education students in conjunction with A&P Supermarkets, Green Teens, and Food Handlers License preparation, each of which provide students with a work experience and opportunity for gainful employment upon graduation.

Special Academic Programs

Activities open to all students, including Bilingual and Special Ed students, are: Honors Bilingual Studies, Advanced Placement, Community Service, Peer Tutoring, Extended Day Instruction, Saturday Academy, Virtual Enterprise, and our YABC and Individual Pathways programs, which are designed to help at-risk students graduate.

Extracurricular Activities

Over 30 clubs and teams such as: Chess, Yearbook, Bowling, Debate, Boys and Girls Volleyball, Basketball, Track, Weight Training; peer counseling and mediation groups; Choral group; Latin jazz band. Our cheerleading squad captured the Citywide Championship for the past three years. Our Chess Club placed 8th in NYC.

Community Support

A & P Supermarkets, Lehman College, Opening Act, Building With Books, The Society for Independent Thought, Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, Green Teens, Take the Field, and the on-site Montefiore Health Clinic provide students with academically and socially enriching programs as well as free health care.

Parent/School Support

Parents participate in our Parents Association, School Leadership Team, and orientation meetings and workshops. Parent representatives attended two leadership retreats with members of the school community. Our Parent Involvement program includes trips and workshops such as Spanish as a Second Language, Computers, and GED.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




