School Mission Statement

We, the parents, students, staff, alumni, and other supporters of excellence at DeWitt Clinton High School believe that high expectations and high standards yield high achievement in both the academic and personal elements of life. All members of the DeWitt Clinton community join in the covenant of scholarship and honor that will ensure that all students master the world class standards of knowledge and personal integrity that will be needed in the twenty-first century. In order to achieve these goals, DeWitt Clinton High School has divided the school into Small Learning Communities. We have six Small Learning Communities which offer students the benefits of a small setting with support services to go along with the advantages of a large school.

Principal's Statement

DeWitt Clinton was selected by Redbook Magazine, in April 1996 as one of the 5 most improved high schools in America, and in January 1999, U.S. News & World Report named DWCHS one of 96 outstanding high schools in America. In 2003, DWCHS was recognized by NASSP as a "Breakthrough" High School. The number of students receiving Regents diplomas has dramatically increased between 1993 and 2006, from 31 to 345, 125 of which were Advanced and 20 Advanced with Honor. Clinton is the school of choice in the Bronx! Over 95% of our graduates were accepted to college and were awarded over \$52 million in scholarships and financial aid in June 2006.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




