School Mission Statement

A community of learners engaged in meaningful work, we capture the energy and interests of youth by providing apprenticeships in the adult world. Our partnership with New York City Outward Bound and designation as a Big Picture School support high achievement, a caring culture, and individualized attention. Throughout one's high school career, the primary learning environment is apprenticeships where students may work at places like a hospital, community garden or law firm. Using real world settings the teachers ensure intensive reading and writing in all subject areas, project-based learning, and community building through outdoor experiences and service to others. The staff knows each child well and connects the real world work to academic projects described by the students' individualized learning plans.

Principal's Statement

The Bronx Guild's mission is to capture the energy and interests of young people through apprenticeships in the adult world. Together with our partner, The New York City Outward Bound Center, we support high achievement, the creation of a caring community, teamwork, and individualized attention. Staff is committed to knowing each student well and supporting all students in using their minds fully as they lead active, productive, and satisfying lives. To date, we have 300 students in 100 different apprenticeship sites. Our students work at the Mayor's Office, American Express, ASPCA, day care centers, with artists, and mechanics.

Special Academic Programs

Programs and Partnerships: Apprenticeships 2 to 3 days per week - worksite assignments or internships connected to academic programs, project-based learning (hydroponics, construction, entrepreneurship), interdisciplinary courses, extended time periods, Outward Bound wilderness and leadership courses.

Leadership & Support: Outward Bound and paid internships, Building with Books. Intellectual: Outward Bound Literacy Club, Reading Group Artistic: Drama Club, Dance. Athletic: Yoga, OPUS Dance Theater, PSAL sports teams (Boys: Baseball, Basketball, Football, Tennis and Volleyball. Girls: Basketball, Softball, Volleyball, Tennis)






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




