School Mission Statement

Hostos Lincoln Academy of Science is an educational partnership of City University of New York and the Board of Education. Faculty, students, parents and community work together in a family atmosphere to achieve student success. We are an early college secondary school located on the campus of Hostos Community College. The vision of the academy is that students will graduate with a Regents Diploma granted by the Department of Education and an Associate Degree from Hostos Community College.

Principal's Statement

Hostos Lincoln Academy of Science was established 17 years ago to help students from underserved communities finish high school and continue on to college. The school has fulfilled this mission and has consistently set high goals for the students.

1. An early college program, where students are expected to complete the requirements for the HS diploma as well as credits for an associate degree from Hostos Community College.
2. A proven academic program with an eighty-five percent graduation rate, students attend a wide variety of colleges (Lehman, Yale, Brooklyn, NYU).
3. Collaborate teaching between secondary teachers and college professors.

Special Academic Programs

Four year allied health science program with hospital internships, college courses, electives in drama, pre-engineering and science program with city college, tutoring with subject teachers after school and on Saturdays. Extensive summer bridge program.

Extracurricular Activities

Student and peer council, Liberty Partnership classes in music, painting, and swimming, city champion debate team, award winning literary magazine, chess club, yearbook, and girl's volleyball.

Community Support

Liberty Partnership, NY Cares for community service, Junior Achievement including the junior ambassadors, entrepreneurship, personal finance and economics programs, BHAG mentors for various grades (Columbia MBA graduates), Lincoln Hospital internships, Stock Market Game, Urban Defense League with debate.






Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School

Average Days Absent




