#### School Mission Statement

#### Principal's Statement

Banana Kelly has 289 students. Our average classroom has 21 students. Every student is in touch with a caring, competent adult, every single day. Our teachers meet regularly in teams to discuss each child's progress and problems and to devise specific learning strategies for that child. Teachers, staff and students collaborate to make our school a community, a family, where young people who might slip through the cracks in a large and impersonal institution, can bloom. Our campus is vibrant. It offers the safety and security of being a place where you are known well by people who care for you. It is what school ought to be.

#### Special Academic Programs

Extra academic support is offered through after school and Saturday school programs. Banana Kelly students participate in EPIIC (Education for Public Inquiry and International Citizenship) Internships, Community Building and student council groups. Our students also participate in College NOW with Hostos.

#### Extracurricular Activities

Our students participate in Building with Books, a track team and a boys basketball team.

#### Community Support

BKHS partnerships include Time Warner, Aspira, Unitas, Teacher's College, Hostos Community College, Lehman College, Mothers on the Move and The Leadership Program.

#### Parent/School Support

Parent involvement at Banana Kelly is comprised of three areas. First, we work to connect parents with community resources for themselves and their children. Second, we are developing parent leadership through trainings and involvement in the SLT and PTA. Finally, we are working to involve parents in the school's daily activities.





## TEACHERS


**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




