#### School Mission Statement

#### Principal's Statement

Our students earn a dual diploma, they meet a very rigorous academic program, and complete a full career and technical program in the areas of Health Careers, Cosmetology, Business, or Paralegal. Our graduates are currently attending universities such as Middlebury, Penn State, Union, Vanderbilt, Wheaton, SUNY, CUNY, etc. Through our collaborations with many hospitals, colleges, the Bronx Zoo, law offices, and the Bronx District Attorney's office, we continue to prepare students for higher education and to enter the work force. We offer Advanced Placement courses in English, Spanish, Environmental Science and U.S. History. Pre-Calculus is offered.

#### Special Academic Programs

Magnet programs in paralegal, desktop publishing/advertising; information technology; marketing/entrepreneurship/virtual enterprise; academy of finance; cosmetology; health careers; nurse assistant; billing & coding; vision technology; EMT/FDNY; peer tutoring; advanced placement and SAT Prep.

#### Extracurricular Activities

During the 2006-2007 school year, our students took part in after school activities such as the MOUSE SQUAD; Debate Team; Building with Books; Explorers; and Chess clubs. Students took part in STEP competitions; joined volleyball, basketball, bowling and handball teams. Students participated in peer mediation and conflict resolution programs.






**Percent More Than Two Years Teaching in This School**

**Average Days Absent**




