In This Report:

District 75 Additional Credit

District 75 schools earn additional credit when they achieve goals that are consistent with the mission of District 75. One of these goals is to successfully educate students in the Least Restrictive Environment that is appropriate for them. Schools earn credit in this area based on preparing students for integration or re-integration into a general education school or placing students in a less restrictive class within District 75. Another key goal of District 75 is to create safe learning environments with positive behavior supports. Schools are recognized in this area for maintaining a low rate of serious disciplinary infractions as defined by Levels 4 and 5 of the Citywide Standards of Intervention and Discipline Measures.

## HOW TO INTERPRET THIS CHART

A school is evaluated by asking how far its score in each category has moved along the range of scores for all schools. These charts show that movement as a percentage. In the example to the right, the school's score is 75% of the way from the lowest to the highest score in the range.

If a school performs at the top end of the range, the bar will be fully shaded. If a school performs at the low end of the range, the bar will not be shaded. If a school performs in the middle of the range, half the bar will be shaded



In this example, the school's Engagement score is 9.0. This is 75% of the way from the lowest Engagement score at any school (6.0) to the highest Engagement score (10.0).
