

How To Interpret These Charts

To determine the number of points earned, this school's 2011-12 results on each metric are compared to the historical results of peer schools and all transfer schools citywide. The comparison to peer schools is worth 75% of the points for each metric and the comparison to all transfer schools citywide is worth 25% of the points. The bars represent the range of results for the peer and city comparison schools for the previous five school years that are within two standard deviations of the average. The percent of the range that is shaded is the school's share of possible points. The share is multiplied by the weight (75% or 25%) and the possible points for the metric to determine the points earned.



Score Calculation Example

FORMULA: $(\text{PERCENT OF PEER RANGE} \times 0.75 + \text{PERCENT OF CITY RANGE} \times 0.25) \times \text{POINTS POSSIBLE} = \text{POINTS EARNED}$

EXAMPLE: $(60\% \times 0.75 + 80\% \times 0.25) \times 5 = 3.25$




College Readiness Index


Postsecondary Enrollment Rate

College and Career Preparatory Course Index


This metric measures the percentage of students in the graduating cohort who have successfully completed approved rigorous courses and assessments (please see the Additional Information page for more information on this index).

How To Interpret These Charts

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Schools receive additional credit for exceptional gains by students with disabilities, English Language Learners and overage/under-credited status. Additional credit will be awarded based on both the percentage of high-need students achieving an exemplary outcome and the percentage of students at the school in that high-need group. Additional Credit can only improve a school's Progress Report score. It cannot lower a school's score. Transfer High Schools are eligible for points on eight additional credit metrics. In the table below, "." in "This School's Results" indicates that a school has fewer than five eligible students for the category in question.

PEER INDEX CALCULATION

The Peer Index sorts schools according to incoming proficiency and demographics. A lower Peer Index indicates a higher need population. The Peer Index operates on a 1.0 to 4.5 scale and is calculated using the following formula:

$$\text{FORMULA: } \left(\text{Average 8th grade English and Math proficiency} \right) - \left(2 \times \% \text{ students with disabilities} \right) - \left(2 \times \% \text{ in self-contained settings} \right) - \left(\% \text{ overage} \right) = \text{PEER INDEX}$$

$$\text{FOR THIS SCHOOL: } \left(2.17 \right) - \left(2 \times 12.0\% \right) - \left(2 \times 4.0\% \right) - \left(74.7\% \right) = 1.10$$
