



Credit Acc. per Year, Students Beginning with 0.00-11.00 Credits (n=111)




Credit Acc. per Year, Students Beginning with 11.01-22.00 Credits (n=116)




Credit Acc. per Year, Students Beginning with 22.01-33.00 Credits (n=128)




Credit Acc. per Year, Students Beginning with 33.01-38.00 Credits (n=39)



Average Change in Student Attendance (n=355)




Average Completion Rate for Remaining Regents (n=406)




**College Readiness Index**


**Postsecondary Enrollment Rate**



## PEER INDEX CALCULATION

The Peer Index sorts schools according to incoming proficiency and demographics. A lower Peer Index indicates a higher need population. The Peer Index operates on a 1.0 to 4.5 scale and is calculated using the following formula:

$$\text{FORMULA: } \left( \text{Average 8th grade English and Math proficiency} \right) - \left( 2 \times \% \text{ students with disabilities} \right) - \left( 2 \times \% \text{ in self-contained settings} \right) - \left( \% \text{ overage} \right) = \text{PEER INDEX}$$
