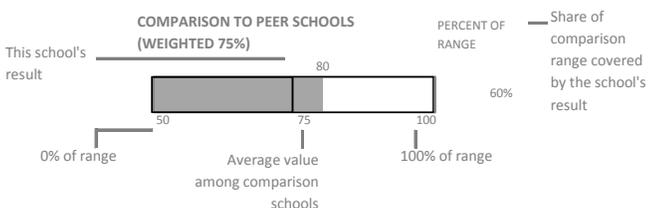

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

Additional Credit can only improve a school's Progress Report score. It cannot lower a school's score. High schools are eligible for points on 7 additional credit metrics, each of which is worth up to 2 points. (In the table below, "." in "This School's Results" indicates that a school has fewer than five eligible students in one of the categories.)

PEER INDEX CALCULATION

The Peer Index is used to sort schools on the basis of student population. A lower Peer Index indicates a higher need population. The Peer Index operates on a 1.00-4.50 scale and is calculated using the following formula.

$$\text{FORMULA} \quad (\text{Average 8th grade English and Math proficiency}) - (2 \times \% \text{ students with disabilities}) - (2 \times \% \text{ in self-contained settings}) - (\% \text{ students overage}) = \text{PEER INDEX}$$
