The remainder of the grade is based on placing students into the least restrictive environment where they can succeed and on changes in attendance.



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**How To Interpret These Charts**

To determine the number of points earned, this school's 2012-13 results on each metric are compared to the results of peer schools. The bars represent the range of results for the peer comparison schools that are within two standard deviations of the average. The percent of the range that is shaded is the school's share of possible points. The share is multiplied by the possible points for the metric to determine the points earned.



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
