
How do your school's responses in the following categories compare to all Elementary Schools?




How do survey response rates at your school compare to the City average?



How have response rates at your school changed over time?




Who took the survey **online**?




How has your school community answered certain important survey questions over time?


How responses of parents at your school have changed:


How satisfied are you with the response you get when you contact your child's school?




