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**THE CLASS OF 2006:
FOUR-YEAR LONGITUDINAL GRADUATION AND DROPOUT REPORT
AND 2005-2006 EVENT DROPOUT RATES**

KEY FINDINGS

Nearly sixty percent (59.7 percent) of students in the Class of 2006 graduated from high school within four years after their entry into the 9th grade. A quarter (25.6 percent) of the Class of 2006 remained enrolled in high school for a fifth year while less than one-sixth (14.6 percent) of the class dropped out at the end of the four years. These statistics have been validated by an independent audit.

The 2006 graduation rate is higher than the previous three classes, 2005 (58.2 percent), 2004 (54.3 percent) and 2003 (53.4 percent). Further, this is the highest on-time graduation rate since the Department of Education (DOE) began reporting these statistics over 20 years ago.

Significant numbers of students are graduating on time or remaining enrolled for a fifth year of high school, in part as a consequence of a change in New York State Diploma requirements. The combined four-year graduation and still-enrolled rates for the Class of 2006 (85.3 percent) was comparable with the Class of 2005 (85.2 percent). In addition, the Class of 2006 dropout rate remained virtually the same as that of the Class of 2005; reflecting a significant decrease in the dropout rate beginning with the Class of 2004. This decrease is partially attributable to a change in DOE policy requiring exit interviews with potential dropouts.

Beginning with the Class of 2005, high school seniors may be awarded two levels of Regents diplomas. The combined percentage of graduates awarded Advanced Regents Diplomas (23.1 percent) and Regents Diplomas (39.9 percent) was 63.0 percent for the Class of 2006, which is a 2.3 percentage point increase over the Class of 2005 (60.7 percent). BACKGROUND

This report presents the progress toward school completion of students who entered the ninth grade in Fall 2002 and were scheduled to graduate on time in Spring 2006 after four years of high school. The Class of 2006 is the twenty-first class for which the Division of Assessment and Accountability (DAA) has conducted a four-year longitudinal study. The report presents outcomes for the class as a whole, as well as outcomes for specific groups of students categorized by gender, English language status, race/ethnicity, and immigrant status. Changes in diploma requirements appear in Appendix A. Four-year outcome data for individual high schools appears in Appendix B. Diploma types by school are presented in Appendix C. Diploma types (Regents, Local, Special Education, GED) by racial/ethnic groups are presented by school in Appendix D. To track trends across classes, comparisons of four-year outcome data for the Classes of 2004, 2005, and 2006 are presented in Appendix E. Event dropout rates appear in Appendix F.

METHODOLOGY

Longitudinal Cohorts

The study follows two student cohorts. One is comprised of students in general education classes, including students receiving special education services in less restrictive settings. This cohort is referred to as the Class of 2006. The other is comprised of students in self-contained special education classes in either regular high schools or in District 75, the citywide special education district which consists of schools that primarily serve students with severe disabling conditions. This cohort is referred to as the Special Education Class of 2006.

Students were assigned to the Class of 2006 based on the year in which they entered Grades 9 through 12. More than nine in ten (94.1 percent) of the students in the Class of 2006 joined the cohort as entering ninth-graders during the 2002-2003 school year, and most had been in the New York City public schools in lower grades. Some entered our school system during Grade 9. The remainder transferred into the New York City public schools during high school and became part of the cohort as tenth graders in 2003-04, as eleventh graders in 2004-05, or as twelfth graders in 2005-2006. All of these students would have completed the traditional four-year high school sequence by Spring or Summer 2006. Students who were discharged to other school systems with confirmation of such enrollment were omitted from the cohort.

Because self-contained special education classes are ungraded, students were assigned to the separate Special Education Class of 2006 cohort based on their age and enrollment in special education programs. Students were included in the Special Education Class of 2006 if they were 14 years old during the 2002-2003 school year and were in a self-contained special education class in a Community School District school, high school, or a citywide special education program (District 75). Students were not added to the Special Education Class of 2006 after the initial year because of the ungraded nature of their classes.

This report primarily focuses on the number and percent of students graduating on time and those still enrolled for a fifth year of high school. Students dropping out of the New York City public schools are also tracked. Related to this focus is the task of determining the status of all of the students in the class at the time the students were expected to graduate. Each student in the study group is determined to be in one of four possible categories based on his or her status at the end of the school year.

Graduates are students who have received a high school diploma, GED, or special education certificate by June or August 2006. **Still-enrolled** students were still on register and scheduled to continue into a fifth year of high school in Fall 2006. **Dropouts** are students who have left the school system without enrolling in another education program that leads either to a high school diploma or prepares the student for the Test of General Educational Development leading to a general equivalency diploma (GED). **Discharges** are students who left the school system primarily to enroll in another educational program or setting. Students who aged out of the school system, i.e., reached the age of 21, and students who died prior to completing high school, are also counted in this category.

Event Dropout Rate

In addition to the Class of 2006 longitudinal data, this report also presents event dropout rates. The event dropout rate represents the number and percentage of students who dropped out of high school during the 2005-2006 school year, regardless of when they entered the school system. Students are counted as dropouts if they left school by the end of the 2005-2006 school year without re-enrolling in another educational setting leading to a high school diploma or GED. Only students who were first-time dropouts during the 2005-2006 school year are counted in the Event Dropout rate for this time period.

FINDINGS

Characteristics of the Class of 2006

During the dates covered by the study (2002-2003 through 2005-2006 school years), the New York City public schools served 85,499 students in the cohort (see Table 1). This included the base population of 76,929 students who entered 9th grade in 2001-2002 and 8,570 students admitted to the class in subsequent years.

Over the four-year period, 17,021 (19.9 percent) were discharged prior to the expected graduation date of Spring 2006. Almost all of these students left New York City and entered another school system. After adding admissions in Grades 10, 11, and 12 and removing students who transferred to other school systems, there were 68,478 students in the Class of 2006.

The 68,478 students in the Class of 2006 had the following characteristics:

- The Class of 2006 contained a slightly higher proportion of females than males (51.1 percent females and 48.9 percent males).
- The ethnic composition of the cohort was 33.9 percent African American, 35.1 percent Hispanic, 15.8 percent White, and 14.7 percent Asian. Less than one percent (0.3 percent) of the students were American Indian/Alaskan Natives. These percentages were nearly the same as those for the Class of 2005.
- Of the 68,478 students, 10.3 percent (7,091 students) were still English Language Learners (ELLs), and entitled to bilingual or English as a Second Language (ESL) services at the end of high school. An additional 28.1 percent (19,239 students) were former ELLs, students who were at one time ELLs but who scored above the 40th percentile on the Language Assessment Battery (LAB), or in recent years scored below the cut-off score on the revised Language Assessment Battery (LAB-R), and who tested out on the New York State Education Department's new exit exam, the New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test (NYSESLAT), before they left high school. The Class of 2006 had a 2.3 percentage point reduction in the number of students still ELLs at the end of four years of high school compared to the Class of 2005 (12.6 percent).

- Almost one fifth (17.5 percent) of the students in the 2006 cohort were recent immigrants to the United States (11,987), a one percentage point decrease over the previous class (18.5 percent). These students came from more than 170 different countries. Of these recent immigrants, 46.9 percent (5,629 students) entered the country in either Grade 7 or Grade 8. The remainder, 53.0 percent (6,358 students), entered the country sometime during or after Grade 9. The percentage of immigrants in the Class of 2006 who entered the New York City public school system at the beginning of high school is 4.4 percentage points less than that of the Class of 2005 (57.4 percent).

General Outcomes for the Class of 2006

The graduation rate for the Class of 2006 increased 1.5 percentage points compared to the Class of 2005. The dropout rate (14.6 percent) for the Class of 2006 remained stable with that of the Class of 2005 (14.8 percent). Of the remaining students, 25.6 percent were still enrolled for a fifth year. The following are the specific outcomes for the Class of 2006 (see Figure 1):


- The four-year graduation rate for the Class of 2006 was 59.7 percent. This is 1.5 percentage points higher than for the Class of 2005 (58.2 percent) and the highest on-time graduation rate since longitudinal analyses were instituted over 20 years ago. Likewise, 25.6 percent remained enrolled in high school for a fifth year while less than one-sixth (14.6 percent) of the class dropped out at the end of the four years. The 2006 graduation rate is higher than the previous three classes, 2005 (58.2 percent), 2004 (54.3 percent), and 2003 (53.4 percent).
- The combined four-year graduation and still-enrolled rates of the Class of 2006 (85.3 percent) is comparable with the Class of 2005 (85.2 percent) and 1.6 percentage points higher than the Class of 2004 (83.7 percent).

Analyses of the Regents examination pass rates of students in the Class of 2006 who are still enrolled for a fifth year of high school support the notion that some students are remaining in school in order to complete course credit and Regents examination requirements. Significant percentages of still-enrolled students are on track for a Regents and Local Diploma at the end of a fifth year of high school.

- The four-year dropout rate for the Class of 2006 was 14.6 percent, similar to the Class of 2005 (14.8 percent). This is the lowest dropout rate since the Department of Education began reporting these statistics over 20 years ago. This reduction is attributable, in part, to a change in policy: specifically: in 2003-2004, DOE changed its policy and required exit interviews for some “over age 17” dropouts. The policy required that students who choose to leave school before they graduate with a diploma be provided with a planning interview with a guidance counselor, assistant principal or principal. The purpose of the planning interview is to (1) discuss with the student and parent the educational options that are available to the student, (2) encourage the student to remain in school, and, (3) if he/she still chooses to leave, to ensure that the student is apprised of his/her right to return to school until the age of 21.

The reduction in dropout rates is due, in part, to recent DOE policy requiring planning interviews for students above compulsory school age before schools are permitted to discharge them to dropout status. The interview process may delay many students from dropping out until their fifth, sixth, or seventh years, and those students will be captured when the DOE calculates final seven-year statistics for the Class of 2006; however, many students may remain enrolled in high school and graduate. As with prior classes, the final determination of the Class of 2006 dropout and graduation rates will not be known for an additional three years.

- Table 2 presents the status of the Class of 2006 for each of the four years of the study. It indicates that of the 10,023 students who dropped out, 1,228 did so after one (319) or two (909) years in high school, 2,860 did so after three years in high school, and 5,935 did so after four years.
- Table 3 presents the types of diplomas earned by the Class of 2006 graduates and the percentages of students receiving them. For the Class of 2006, the percentage of graduates awarded either Advanced Regents Diplomas (23.1 percent) or Regents Diplomas (39.9 percent) was 63.0 percent; this is 2.3 percentage points more than the Class of 2005 (60.7 percent). Beginning in 2005, students received either (1) an Advanced Regents Diploma, earning the appropriate 22 units of credits and scoring at least 65 on eight Regents examinations; or, (2) a Regents Diploma by earning the appropriate 22 units of credit credits and scoring at least 65 on the five required Regents examinations in English, Mathematics, U.S. History and Government, Global History and Geography, and Science; or, (3) a Local Diploma by earning the appropriate 22 units of credit and scoring between a 55-64 on the five required Regents examinations. Prior to the class of 2005, students had to pass eight Regents examinations to receive a Regents Diploma, while Local Diploma requirements have remained the same.
- Table 4 presents the types of diplomas earned by the Classes of 2006, 2005 and 2004 and compares diplomas earned by graduates and diplomas earned if one examines all students in the cohort. For the Class of 2006, 63.0 percent of graduates received either Advanced Regents or Regents diplomas. Although 39.9 percent of graduates earned a Regents Diploma, only 23.8 percent of the cohort as a whole graduated with a Regents Diploma at the end of four years; likewise, in 2006, 23.1 percent of graduates earned an Advanced Regents Diploma (13.7 percent of the cohort). Of the 2005 graduates, 60.6 percent received either an Advanced Regents Diploma or a Regents Diploma.
- Table 5 summarizes the types of diplomas earned by students of different racial/ethnic groups in the Class of 2006. As indicated in this table, there is a wide disparity in the percentage of students earning Regents Diplomas by race/ethnicity with far higher percentages of White and Asian students receiving Advanced Regents or Regents Diplomas than Native American, African American or Hispanic students.

Outcomes by Student Groups

Outcomes by Gender

- A substantially higher percentage of females (64.4 percent) than males (54.9 percent) graduated on time (see Figure 2). The dropout rate of males was 3.9 percentage points higher than that of females (16.6 percent compared to 12.7 percent). Also, a higher percentage of males (28.5 percent) were still enrolled and entering a fifth year of high school compared to females (22.9 percent). These findings are similar to those reported for the Class of 2005.

Outcomes by Age for Grade on Entry into High School

- Many students who entered the cohort in Grade 9 were already over age for grade. This may be due to previous retention in our schools or because the students were over age when they entered the New York City public schools. Figure 3 indicates the percentage of students in each category who were either over age or the expected age for grade when they entered high school. As the results show, 82.4 percent of the students who graduated in four years were the expected age for grade when they entered Grade 9. In contrast, 38.3 percent of the students who became dropouts were the expected age when they entered Grade 9, and 61.7 percent were already over age for the grade. The percentages for the still-enrolled students are more similar to those for the graduates than the dropouts. Since the age-for-grade factor has a strong relationship with school completion, it is expected that a high percentage of the still-enrolled students will earn a degree in the fifth, sixth, and seventh years of high school.

Outcomes by Racial/Ethnic Background

- Figure 4 reports the four-year school-completion outcomes for each racial/ethnic group. As observed for earlier cohorts, White and Asian students had the highest four-year graduation rates (76.9 percent and 74.5 percent, respectively) and the lowest dropout rates (9.3 percent and 8.8 percent, respectively). Conversely, the graduation rate for African American students was 54.6 percent with a dropout rate of 15.0 percent. Hispanic students had a four-year graduation rate of 50.8 percent and a dropout rate of 19.1 percent. For American Indians/Alaskan Native students, the graduation rate was 51.9 percent and the dropout rate was 17.5 percent. Still-enrolled rates were 13.8, 16.8, 30.4, 30.0, and 30.6 percent for White, Asian, African American, Hispanic, and American Indians/Alaskan Native students, respectively. Table 6 provides comparisons by racial/ethnic group for the Classes of 2002 through 2006.
- For the Class of 2006, the dropout rate continued to decrease slightly for all but American Indian/Alaskan Native students. Specifically, the percentage-point decrease in student dropout rates by group was: White (-0.4 of a percentage point); Asian (-0.9 of a percentage point); African American (-0.2 of a percentage point); and Hispanic (-.1 of a percentage point). The dropout rate increased slightly for American Indian/Alaskan Native students (+0.1 of a percentage point). All groups continued to experience an increase in graduation rates except for

American Indian/Alaskan Native students: Hispanics (+1.4 percentage points), Whites (+1.4 percentage points); Asians (+1.3 percentage points); and African Americans (+2.5 percentage points). American Indian/Alaskan Natives had a -0.8 of a percentage point decrease. (Note: because there are few American Indian/Alaskan Native students system-wide, this group experiences greater year-to-year fluctuations in graduation, enrollment, and dropout rates than other racial/ethnic groups.)

- Finally, the percentage of students still enrolled for a fifth year of high school decreased for all groups in 2006 (25.6 percent) compared with 2005 (27.0 percent).

Outcomes for English Language Learners

- As reported earlier, 7,091 (10.3 percent) of the students in the Class of 2006 were still ELLs at the end of four years of high school, and 19,239 (28.0 percent) were former ELLs. (Former ELLs are students who tested out of a bilingual or free-standing English as a Second Language program.) These students spent at least part of their high school careers in bilingual or free-standing English as a Second Language programs.
- Overall, the school completion outcomes of current ELLs fall short of those for non-ELL students (see Figure 5). Current ELLs had lower four-year graduation rates than either former ELLs or English Proficient students. However, ELLs were still enrolled at a much higher rate than former ELLs or English Proficient students, suggesting that the gap in school completion outcomes between ELLs and the other groups will be reduced when the final statistics for the Class of 2006 are reported in the three-year follow-up study. This reduction in disparity has been observed consistently in three-year follow-up studies, including that for the Class of 2003, followed for three additional years until June 2006.

Outcomes for Recent Immigrants

- In the Class of 2006, 17.5 percent (or 11,987 students) were identified as recent immigrants. Students who are recent immigrants can be divided into two groups. The first group, which represents 46.9 percent of recent immigrants, is comprised of students who first entered New York City public middle schools in Grades 7 or 8. The second group, representing 53.0 percent of recent immigrants, entered the Class of 2006 in Grade 9 or after. It is important to note that although many immigrants are ELLs, ELLs may be either immigrants or non-immigrants.
- The outcomes for the students in the Class of 2006 by immigrant status are reported in Figure 6. As with the Class of 2005, the results for the Class of 2006 are somewhat different from previous classes for the group labeled “Immigrants on Entry into Class of 2006.” As a group, immigrants come to our schools relatively prepared to succeed in high school. For the Class of 2006, students who were recent immigrants to our schools in grades 7 and 8 had a dropout rate of 13.0 percent, lower than the 14.6 percent dropout rate for all students citywide. The graduation rate for students who immigrated in Grades 7 and 8 (59.0

percent) was higher than that of students who were immigrants when they entered the Class of 2006 in grades 9-12 (50.5 percent), and almost the same as that of non-immigrant students (60.8 percent).

Compared with the Class of 2004, there was a sustained two-year increase of more than an 8 percentage-point increase in percent of students who graduated in 2006 and were immigrants when they entered the Class of 2006 (Class of 2004, 42.2 percent; Class of 2005, 50.3 percent; Class of 2006, 50.5 percent). Likewise, there was a corresponding decrease of 11.2 percentage points in the number of students who were still-enrolled and were immigrants when they entered the Class of 2006. The percentage of students who dropped out of school increased from 16.6 percent in 2004 to 18.6 percent in 2005 and decreased slightly to 18.3 percent in 2006.

Similar to the trend observed among all “still-enrolled” students in the Class of 2006, analyses indicate that a sizable number of new immigrants who entered NYC school in Grade 9 are on track to obtain a Regents Diploma at the end of their fifth year of high school. It may well be that immigrants who enter our high schools in ninth grade are finding the increasingly more rigorous diploma requirements challenging to fulfill in four years but that significant numbers will be able to earn a high school diploma in five, six, or seven years.

Outcomes by High School Type

The high schools that students attend can be categorized into five basic types. The Specialized High Schools require students to pass special entrance examinations. The Career and Technical Education Schools offer programs that prepare students for jobs in a vocational or technical area, as well as for college. The zoned Academic-Comprehensive High Schools, many of which have special programs with various admission requirements, are required to accept all students who wish to attend and live in the school’s zone. Transfer Alternative High Schools accept students as transfers from other high schools; these schools provide smaller settings that emphasize academic and personal support. Retrieval/GED programs offer smaller settings designed for students with special problems, many of which place them at risk of dropping out such as substance abuse and criminal activity.

These programs provide individualized academic and personal assistance to their students so they can return to their high schools or prepare for the GED.

- As Figure 7 indicates, there was wide variation in the four-year outcomes for students by school type. Students in Specialized High Schools had the highest on-time graduation rate (97.4 percent) and lowest dropout rate (0.2 percent). Students in Retrieval/GED programs had the highest dropout rate (51.0 percent), and students in Transfer Alternative High Schools had the highest still-enrolled rate (60.0 percent). These trends are similar to those reported for the Class of 2005.


Outcomes for Special Education Students

Students in the Special Education Class of 2006 were 14 years old during the 2001-2002 school year and were enrolled in a citywide special education school or self-contained class in a middle school or high school. Due to the different nature of the programs, results for the Special Education Class of 2006 are reported separately for students in citywide programs (District 75) and high school self-contained classes. After excluding 563 students in citywide special education programs who were discharged to other school systems, 1,445 students were identified as members of that group. After excluding 1,428 students in high school self-contained classes who were discharged to other school systems, 5,053 students were identified as members of that group. The results for the Special Education Class of 2006, reported in Figure 8, indicate the following:

- Nearly two percent (1.9 percent) of the District 75 cohort graduated in four years in the Class of 2006. Likewise, the four-year graduation rate for special education students in self-contained classes increased to 12.8 percentage points in the Class of 2006 (0.7 percentage points higher than that of the Class of 2005).
- For students in District 75 citywide programs, the Class of 2006 dropout rate was 20.0 percent, and the dropout rate for special education students in self-contained classes was 18.9 percent (See Figure 8). This represents an increase of 3.2 percentage points over the Class of 2005 (16.8 percent). The dropout rate for students in self-contained classes increased by 1.1 percentage point over the Class of 2005 (17.8 percent).
- Nearly three-fifths (68.4 percent) of the high school special education students in self-contained classrooms and four-fifths (78.1 percent) of the students in District 75 citywide programs were identified as still enrolled in school as of June 30, 2006. These percentages are slightly less than the comparable percentage of students still enrolled in the Class of 2005 (70.1 percent and 80.3 percent, respectively). However, that such large percentages of special education students are still enrolled after four years is not surprising. Many special education students are in programs designed to provide services until students are 21 years old. At that time, many of these students are expected to participate in adult programs for former special education students.

Four-Year Outcomes for the Class of 2006, by Gender




**Age for Grade on Entry into High School




Four-Year Outcomes for the Class of 2006 by English Language Learner Status


Outcomes for the Class of 2006, by Immigrant Status

Four-Year Outcomes for the Class of 2006 by School Type



TRENDS

Trends Across Classes

- Dropout rates have been tracked longitudinally for the past several years. As Table 7 shows, the dropout rate for the Class of 2006 (14.6 percent) remained stable compared to the Class of 2005 (14.8 percent), and more than 5 percentage points less over five years compared to the Classes of 2004 (16.3 percent), 2003 (20.3 percent), 2002 (20.3) and 2001 (20.4 percent). It is the lowest four-year dropout rate since 1992, and is due, in part, to a change in DOE policy requiring planning interviews before students may be discharged as dropouts. Some of these students decide to remain in school as a result of the planning interviews.

Trends in Event Dropout Rates

The event dropout rate represents the number of students who dropped out of high school for the first time during the 2005-06 school year, regardless of when they entered the system. Students are counted as dropouts if they left school by the end of the 2005-06 school year without re-enrolling in another educational setting leading to a high school diploma or GED. Only students who were first-time dropouts during the 2005-06 school year are counted in this analysis. The counts include all students in all schools, including students in self-contained special education classes. Individual school event dropout rates as well as rates by Region appear in Appendix F.

As noted in Table 8, the event dropout rate for 2005-2006 (6.9 percentage points) remains steady when compared to the 2004-2005 event dropout rate of 6.6 percentage points. In 2003-2004, DOE changed its policy and required exit interviews for some “over 17” dropouts. This policy change contributed substantially to a reduction in the dropout rate. During 2002-2003, the decrease in event dropout rates reflected changes in reporting procedures required by the New York State Education Department. For the purposes of comparison, dropout rates for 2001-2002 were recalculated using the same methodology as in 2002-2003.

The interview process may delay many students from dropping out until their fifth, sixth, or seventh years, and those students will be captured when the DOE calculates final seven-year statistics for the Class of 2006; however, many students may remain enrolled in high school and graduate. CONCLUSIONS

Six in ten (59.7 percent) of the students in the Class of 2006 graduated from high school in four years. This is the highest on-time graduation rate since the DOE began reporting the statistics. Since the Class of 2002, there has been a steady increase in the percentage of students who graduate in four years. In addition, over 25 percent (25.6 percent) of students still-enrolled for a fifth year of high school are on track to complete their course credit requirements and Regents examinations for a Regents or Local diploma at the end of their fifth year of high school.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Close attention to the findings of the studies of the Classes over the past several years have led to a number of recommendations for systemic improvement of our schools. These include such broad-based initiatives as: (1) Multiple Pathways to Graduation, an initiative launched in 2005 to meet the needs of the overage and under-credited high school student population most at-risk of dropping out of school; (2) standards-based curriculum and instruction in Grades K-12; (3) focused instructional strategies and aligned professional development activities; and (4) enhanced family engagement activities.

In coordination with efforts to improve attendance and prevent students from dropping out, high schools have implemented instructional and organizational initiatives related to these and other educational strategies so as to enable a diverse student population to meet standards and graduation requirements. These include:

- Systemic and focused instructional initiatives on secondary literacy and mathematics;
- Classroom libraries purchased to provide teachers with additional resources to address the literacy needs of high school students;
- Reduced class size and increased instructional time in English and mathematics for students who have not yet met standards;
- Additional instruction before and after school and/or weekends, including additional in-class instructional support;
- Individual and small-group tutoring to improve basic skills;
- Summer school programs for students who are failing or who are at risk of failing to meet standards;
- Creation of new schools and new school designs to foster smaller, more personalized learning environments for students and families;
- Middle school to high school transitions; fostering successful academic and developmental transition from middle to high school;
- Middle school and 9th grade intervention initiatives, including a new 7th grade promotional policy in 2005-06, with the goal of improving middle school achievement and preparedness for high school work;
- Establishment of various program designs, such as the Young Adult Borough Centers (YABC) and Day and Evening High Schools, for older students who are unable to attend high school during regular school hours;

- System-wide focus on parent and family involvement to ensure more parent participation and input through the creation of a Parent Coordinator position within each school, and parent outreach centers in Regional Offices;
- Sustained and on-going professional development and support for teachers, including the provision of literacy and mathematics coaches in schools; and
- The addition of professional development time to school schedules to provide opportunities to further the professional growth of teachers.

These initiatives should be continued. In addition, more specific and sustained focus on supporting and encouraging students who fear they may ‘age-out’ without ever meeting the new standards will help to keep more students in school long enough to meet the new diploma requirements for graduation. The New York City Department of Education’s continued focus on the creation of Multiple Pathways to Graduation for students (e.g., evening high school classes); the implementation of standards-based curriculum and instruction for all students, in conjunction with aligned professional development for teachers; and enhanced family engagement will help to ensure that all students meet these higher standards.

APPENDIX F

2005-2006 EVENT DROPOUT RATES

The event dropout rate represents the number of students who dropped out of high school during the 2005-2006 school year, regardless of when they entered the school system. Students are counted as dropouts if they left school by the end of the 2005-2006 school year without re-enrolling in another educational setting leading to a high school diploma or GED. Only students who were first-time dropouts during the 2005-2006 school year are counted. The counts include all students in the schools, including students in self-contained special education classes. The event dropout rate for 2005-2006 reflects differences in reporting procedures required by the New York State Education Department because of changes in decision rules for counting dropouts and for reflecting students' status as of June 30th of the reporting year rather than as of the fall of the following year.
