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The Class of 2004 Final Longitudinal Report A Three-Year Follow-Up Study

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Research and Policy Support Group

At the time of their expected four-year graduation date in June 2004 (See **Figure 1**), 37,028 students (54.3 percent) had completed high school. By June 2007, three years after their expected graduation date, 45,910 students (72.2 percent) had completed high school, either by receiving a high school diploma or GED. The remaining 27.8 percent of the students were identified as dropouts. A total of 15,626 students had been discharged to other school systems at the end of four years. Discharges to other school systems increased by 2,375 students to 18,001 students (22.1 percent of the entering class) at the end of seven years. These discharged students are not included in the outcome calculations.

Table 1 presents the types of diplomas earned by Class of 2004 graduates.

Table 2 compares this information to the types of diplomas earned by graduates in the last seven classes.

Figure 2 shows the final outcomes for students in the Class of 2004 by gender.

Figure 3 shows the four-year and final outcomes for the Class of 2004 by race/ethnicity.

As **Figure 4** indicates, overall, the final school completion outcomes of Current ELLs fall short of those of former ELLs and Never ELL students. Students who were still eligible for ESL/bilingual services at the end of high school (Current ELLs) had lower final graduation rates than non-ELL students. Former ELLs had higher graduation rates than non-ELL students in all years. The final graduation rates for Current ELLs, Former ELLs, and Never ELLs are 55.1 percent, 79.0 percent, and 72.7 percent respectively.


In addition to the Class of 2004 described above, we also report on a separate cohort of un-graded Special Education students comprising those students who were in a self-contained special education class in a high school, middle school, or citywide (District 75) program during the 1999-2000 school-year and were born in 1986. Additional students were not added to this cohort in subsequent school years. As with their general education peers, students in this cohort were followed for three full school years beyond their expected graduation date. It has been noted in previous reports that special education programs are designed to provide services until students are 21 years old. Thus, four-year expected graduation rates are not necessarily relevant to students in special education classes and programs. The outcomes were analyzed by program type because of the differences between programs. The results of these follow-ups, by program type, are presented in **Figure 5**.

The Department of Education has studied cohort classes through the seventh and final year beginning with the Class of 1986. The results for the Class of 2004 represent the eighteenth class studied through to completion since cohort analyses were initiated. (A final follow-up was not completed for the Class of 1991.) **Table 3** shows the final results for the 18 classes studied.

Interestingly, **Table 4** presents the final results for the Classes of 2002 through 2004 by the number of years in high school. These data show that the vast majority of those who graduated did so in either four or five years (93.9 percent, 93.7 percent, and 93.4 percent for the Classes of 2002, 2003 and 2004 respectively).

Table 5 examines the final graduation rates for the Class of 1996 through the Class of 2004 by racial/ethnic group and ELL status.

as of June 2007



as of June 2007




Final Outcomes for Students in the Special Education Class of 2004



^a For the years 1996-2000, ELLs were defined as any student identified as eligible for bilingual or free-studying English as a second language services at any time during the first four years of high school—regardless of whether students subsequently “tested out” of entitlement. Beginning in year 2000, a revised definition of ELLs was implemented (i.e., Current ELLs, Former ELLs, and Never ELLs). These two methods of categorizing students as English Language Learners led to differences in the number of students categorized as ELLs during high school and this difference in definition leads to differences in outcomes. For purposes of comparison, results have been reported both ways for the Class of 2000. For the Classes of 2001 - 2003, results have been reported using the new ELL definitions only.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This report followed the progress of the students in the Class of 2004 through the end of June 2007, three full years past their expected graduation date. As the results indicated, by June 2007, 72.2 percent of the students in the class had completed their high school education, and 27.8 percent had either dropped out of school or had not completed their education. The final graduation rate of 72.2 percent of the Class of 2004 is 5.3 percentage points higher than the Class of 1986. However, during that time, high school diploma requirements have increased substantially in New York State.

The results are a further indication that high school is not a four-year academic sequence to be completed by the time a student is 18 years old. 19.3 percent of the students in the Class of 2004 completed their high school education after their expected graduation date. From another perspective, 93.4 percent of all Class of 2004 graduates completed their education in either four or five years. Further, as has been observed in earlier follow-up studies, many students previously identified as dropouts, return and complete their education, usually by obtaining a GED. In fact, 6.5 percent of the class had earned GEDs by the end of the follow-up study.

Numerous other studies have indicated that the New York City public school population has unique needs that require students to take longer to complete their education, including the needs of students whose native language is not English. Particularly noteworthy was the very high percentage of ELL students who were still enrolled in high school after four years and went on to earn a degree within the next three years. This brought their final graduation rate closer to that of non-ELL students that it was after four years
