

Reminder:

The Individualized Educational Prescription (**IEP**) is a document that reflects your child's current educational abilities and needs (aka strengths and weaknesses) with recommendations for any related services that may be needed to reach the goals identified by the Committee on Special Education (**CSE**) over a period of three years. You have the right to request an updated CSE review or re-evaluation if within the three year period (date of the IEP Conference Date) you feel that significant progress has been made which is not reflected by the current IEP in your possession.

If you are past or approaching the triennial date (Federal law requires that CSE complete a full evaluation at least once every three years), you may wish to remind the CSE in writing to schedule the testing asap.

Related Service Authorizations (**RSA**) can only be issued with an up-to-date CSE IEP and the CSE doing a data entry into the CAP system. If you need a change in your child's related services, this should be discussed with the CSE asap who is handling your child's educational information.

In summary, please make sure that you have the most current IEP information as possible on your child..
