Immunization and Health Requirements for Student Registration 2009-2010

The New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene have issued the Medical Requirements for New School Entrants for the 2009-2010 school year. The law requires that all new students – children entering day care, nursery school, pre-school or pre-kindergarten, and kindergarten through grade 12 in New York City for the first time – must show proof of having received a complete medical evaluation. Parents can keep track of their child's immunization record's by referring to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's Citywide Immunization Registry

(CIR), by calling (212) 676-2323.

Flu Shots & H1N1 Information

Flu & H1N1 shots are available throughout the five boroughs. For locations & information on this, you can call (212) 676-2323 or 311.

Health Insurance

Children's health insurance is available to most uninsured children under the age of 19 in New York City. Your child may be eligible for one of two child health insurance programs, Child Health Plus A (formerly Medicaid) or Child Health Plus B - New York's two health insurance Program's for children.

Medicaid and Child Health Plus, are now united under one name, Child Health Plus. Child Health Plus is a comprehensive health insurance program that covers most child health and dental needs. The program's income requirements make it possible for working families to get free or low-cost health insurance for their children.

CCSE – Committee on Special Education

The Citywide Council on Special Education (CCSE) will advise and comment on citywide special education services in (District 75). Nine of the eleven voting members of the CCSE are parents of students receiving citywide special education services. Two additional voting members were appointed by the Public Advocate and have extensive experience and knowledge in educating, training or employing individuals with disabilities. The committee on Special Education meets on the first and second Wednesdays of every month. All meetings are opened to the public.
