SUBJECT: SUBSTITUTE VOCATIONAL ASSISTANT (SVA) PROGRAM

The Substitute Vocational Assistant, SVA, initiative is a teacher recruitment program targeting the need for vocational teachers. The SVA program includes a five-year internship -- three years of occupational work experience and two years of classroom teacher training. College study leading to a Provisional Teaching Certificate, is also provided. Upon completion of the program, interns agree to work in the City School System as vocational teachers for a minimum of five years.

The SVA allocation provides State Incentive Grant (SIG)/Improving Pupil Performance (IPP) funding to defray the salary, fringe benefit and indirect costs associated with each SVA intern. The attached table lists each participating district's entitlement. Allotments should be scheduled in the reimbursable budget, quick code: 25412.
