Based on a commitment of funds from the Mayor’s Office of Management and Budget, advance allocations are being made to districts. Award amounts are presented as follows:

Awards are granted to schools that enroll between 70 and 100 percent of their uninsured students into Medicaid and Child Health Plus. The grant stipulates that funds must be used for “educational purposes,” consistent with BOE spending guidelines.

Allotments will be placed in district’s tax levy budgets, quick-object-line codes: 004577-053-5141. A budget modification scheduling the funds should be prepared after the initial schedule is completed.
