SUBJECT: **Middle School Intervention**

The Department of Education is continuing the middle school academic intervention program which will target the academic needs of struggling middle school students. The purpose of the program is to raise student achievement in English language arts and mathematics, as well as other core subject areas.

This allocation memorandum provides tax-levy funds to enable eligible middle schools to expand academic intervention services for struggling students, defined as students scoring at Level 1 or Level 2 on spring citywide reading and/or math tests.

All participating schools will:

- Review the academic needs of the school's struggling students. As with all intervention programs, staff should review the academic progress and specific needs of individual students, paying particular attention to those who have been previously retained or are overage, English language learners or special needs students.
- Plan and deliver supplemental direct instructional services for these Level 1 and Level 2 middle school students.
- Plan a system of ongoing informal formative assessment to take place at the start of program, at mid-year point and at end-of-the-year to determine intervention efficacy for individual students.

- Prepare a written plan as part of the Comprehensive Educational Plan. This plan must meet program and funding requirements and align with the school's comprehensive education plan.
- Schedule funds in Galaxy in accordance with the approved program plan.
- Implement the approved plan and modify, with LIS approval, if necessary. All modifications must meet program and funding requirements.
- Maintain required documentation at the school site.

This plan (Appendix 4) is to be included in the school's Comprehensive Education Plan.

Allowable Program Activities

Funds must be used to implement direct instructional services for targeted struggling students and for related professional development and parent involvement. The following are examples of allowable activities:

- Small group or individual instruction by a teacher in literacy and/or mathematics using research-based intervention approaches such as those described in the Academic Intervention Services Toolkit.
- Small group or individual instruction related to literacy in core subjects.
- Acquisition of instructional materials to support the struggling students' instructional program, such as those suggested in the Academic Intervention Services (AIS) Toolkit.
- Professional development for staff who will implement the struggling students program or will teach in the Saturday Academy.
- Professional development for teachers of core subjects on strategies to help struggling students succeed, for example support strategies for reading content-area materials.
- Opportunities for program teachers to collaborate in the development of Personal Intervention Plans (PIPs) and carry out other AIS related activities.
- Opportunities for intervention and subject area teachers to plan jointly to meet the needs of participating students.
- Parent involvement activities for the parents of students participating in the struggling student's instructional program focused on helping their children achieve academic success.
- Opportunities to participate in local professional development conferences.

Allocation Methodology

Allocations are based on number of seventh grade general education students and ELLs with 6 or more years in an English Language School System that scored Level 1 on the English Language Arts or Mathematics exam in 2005. Schools with 12 or more such students will receive an allocation of \$1503 per student.

Phase-out schools that no longer have a seventh grade but have an eighth grade will receive one-third of the allocation.

The allocations for schools that had a sixth grade but no seventh grade in 2005 are based on the number of general education students and ELLs with 6 or more years in an English Language School System that scored Level 1 on English Language Arts or Mathematics on their sixth grade tests in 2005. An amendment for schools that did not have sixth or seventh graders in 2005 will be made when the 2006 test data is available.

Funds should be scheduled in the allocation category: **TL MIDDLE SCHOOL INTERVENTION.**

Schools may encumber or expend funds when the Comprehensive Educational Plan is approved.

Schools are required to maintain the following documentation:

- Comprehensive Education Plan, including the struggling students program plan as an addendum.
- Documentation of student assessment and progress, including Personal Intervention Plans for targeted 7th grade students.
- Updated lists of AIS participants.
- Documentation of activities and expenditures.
