SUBJECT: **EXTENDED DAY FOR HIGH SCHOOLS PROGRAM (formerly Evening
High School)**

This memorandum introduces the replacement of the Evening High School program with a new "Extended Day" high school model. The Extended Day model offers day high schools control over the design and implementation of programs to support at-risk high school students. The Office of Secondary Schools (OSS) has completed a competitive grants process to identify schools ready to implement Extended Day for High School program.

Initial allocations were based on grants awarded to those high schools that demonstrate the capacity to design and implement innovative Extended Day programs for the 2006-07 school year. Please note that all schools continue to be accountable for meeting the needs of all students, including the responsibility to provide opportunities for credit recovery and regents exam preparation, whether or not awarded a grant. Schools receiving funds under this program are expected to work collaboratively with colleague schools to support the needs of students without access to credit recovery opportunities in their own school. It is the responsibility of the student's day high school program to make appropriate arrangements with nearby schools to support such students.

Guidelines for Extended Day for High School Allocations

Through the Extended Day program, the funds from Evening High School are being redirected to the high schools that are ultimately responsible for the performance of their students. This accountability aligns with the overall framework of the present Children First school reforms in New York City.

Implementing Extended Day for High Schools programs in schools requires thoughtful and careful planning and execution. This program places instruction at students' home schools or in programs with the direct participation of the leadership and staff of the home school, where their progress toward graduation is monitored by the teachers and administrators who know them best.

The Extended Day for High Schools program offers schools the flexibility to respond to the needs of their own students with the instruction the students need most – credit recovery, Regents Examination Prep, or skill intervention – to move toward graduation. Extended Day for High Schools programs are expected to support the needs of General Education students, Special Education students, and English Language Learners.

These funds may only be used for activities related specifically to the development and implementation of the Extended Day for High Schools program.

Allocation Methodology

Initial allotments follow from a competitive grant process run by the Office of Secondary Schools. For awarded proposals, initial allocations are per capita, based on the number of identified students in the targeted need group identified in the school's proposal, or 50% of the school's total register, whichever is higher. Once the base number of eligible pupils was determined for each proposal, a 70% attendance rate was assumed. An additional per pupil allocation is allotted to schools identified as high needs, based on test scores, numbers of English language learners and Special Education students; graduation rate history; and the number of students historically sent to Evening High School program. A second allocation will be released in January, after a careful program-by-program analysis of participation and success rates.

Funds should be scheduled in allocation category: "TL Extended Day High School"
Citywide Schools only (D97): "TL Extended Day High School CW"

Data Reporting Requirements

The Office of Secondary Schools will require rigorous data reporting for this program. In order to facilitate such reporting, schools hosting an Extended Day for High Schools program are expected to schedule the program on High School Scheduling and Transcripts (HSST). Requests for exception to this requirement should be directed to Sandy Ferguson, Director for Secondary Schools at SFerguson@schools.nyc.gov. In cases where such exception is granted, schools will be required to schedule and report attendance and credit accumulation in ATS. Regular attendance and credit accumulation reports will be required of schools for the purpose of program evaluation.
