SUBJECT: **EXTENDED DAY FOR HIGH SCHOOLS PROGRAM (*formerly Evening High School*) – *Supplementary Allocation***

This memorandum releases the supplementary allocation for the Extended Day for High School program. The Extended Day model offers day high schools control over the design and implementation of programs to support at-risk high school students. The Office of Secondary Schools (OSS) originally awarded Extended Day for High School program funding through a competitive grants process. The supplementary allocation detailed in this memorandum is performance-driven and is intended to supplement and support Extended Day for High School programs.

Please note that all schools continue to be accountable for meeting the needs of all students, including providing opportunities for credit recovery and Regents Exam preparation, whether or not awarded a grant. Schools receiving funds under this program are expected to work collaboratively with affiliated schools to support the needs of students without access to credit recovery opportunities in their own school. It is the responsibility of the student's day high school program to make appropriate arrangements with nearby schools to support such students.

Guidelines for Extended Day for High School Allocations

Through the Extended Day program, the funds from Evening High School are being redirected to the high schools that are ultimately responsible for the performance of their students. This accountability aligns with the overall framework of the present *Children First* school reforms in New York City, by directing accountability and decision-making to the home school.

Implementing the Extended Day for High Schools program in schools requires thoughtful and careful planning and execution. This program places instruction at students' home schools or in programs with the direct participation of the leadership and staff of the home schools, where students' progress toward graduation is monitored by the teachers and administrators who know them best.

The Extended Day for High Schools program offers schools the flexibility to respond to the needs of their own students with the instruction the students need most – credit recovery, Regents Examination prep, or skill intervention – to move toward graduation. Extended Day for High Schools programs are expected to support the needs of General Education students, Special Education students, and English Language Learners.

These funds may only be used for activities related specifically to the development and implementation of the Extended Day for High Schools program.

Allocation Methodology

The Office of Secondary Schools used two sources of data to create performance-driven supplemental allocations to support Extended Day for High School programs by making a mid-year comparison of:

- The number of students identified by school or cluster to be served by the Extended Day for High School program;
- The actual program register and attendance for Extended Day for High School programs at each site.

Performance data was generated by taking an aggregate of each program's daily attendance percentage and multiplying by the number of students on the program register to produce an average number of students attending each program. The supplemental funding allocation was created using the percentage of projected students versus the average number of students served by each program in the fall.

For schools that have exceeded 100% performance against their projection, there is a per capita increase in funding to support the additional students attending. This has allowed the Office of Secondary Schools to direct funds to those sites serving the largest number of students, and to adjust allocations to match actual register and attendance at those sites that have not supported the projected register. Schools with low attendance in the fall did not receive supplemental funding and are expected to apply previously allocated funds to support Extended Day for HS activities during the second half of the school year.

Funds should be scheduled in the allocation category: "[TL Extended Day High School](#)" or "[TL Extended Day High School CW](#)"

Data Reporting Requirements

The Office of Secondary Schools will continue to require rigorous data reporting for this program. Schools are responsible for maintaining and reporting accurate performance data. Schools hosting an Extended Day for High Schools program must schedule the program on High School Scheduling and Transcripts (HSST). Requests for exception to this requirement should be directed to Sandy Ferguson, Director for Secondary Schools at SFerguson@schools.nyc.gov. In cases where such exception is granted, schools will be required to report attendance and credit accumulation manually. Regular attendance and credit accumulation reports will continue to be required of schools for the purpose of program evaluation, throughout the year.
