### **ROBIN HOOD LIBRARIES**

#### **Summary**

The Robin Hood Library Initiative is a partnership between the Robin Hood Foundation and the Department of Education aimed to improved literacy in New York City elementary schools.

#### **Purpose**

The goal of this initiative is to improve literacy through revitalizing school libraries. Thirty one schools are participating in this imitative where their libraries were remodeled. The facilities are also available for community use through after-school and weekend openings.

#### **Restrictions on Funds**

Funds should be used to fund the designated staff titles and materials to support the Robin Hood Libraries.

#### **Allocation Formula**

Funding for this initiative will be scheduled in the Allocation Category “TL One-Time Allocation” and “Robin Hood” should be selected from the dropdown list.

**SUBJECT:** **Robin Hood Libraries-REVISED September 19, 2007**

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The Robin Hood Library Initiative is a partnership between the Robin Hood Foundation and the Department of Education (DOE). The goal of this collaboration is to improve literacy by revitalizing school libraries. To this effect, school libraries were remodeled. The libraries are also available for community use through after-school and weekend openings. This memorandum is being revised to include funding for cohort I schools. Originally, funding was only provided to cohort II schools.

The Robin Hood allocation provides to each school the following:

- One library teacher position at the school's average teacher salary
- One paraprofessional position at \$27,263
- After-school/weekend operation at \$10,400
- Library books at \$6.00 per projected October 2006 pupil count.

Paraprofessional positions must be scheduled at actual salary. Should the allocated amount exceed the paraprofessional's cost, excess funds may be moved to the after-school amount.

The attached table lists each school's allocation. Funds are to be scheduled in the Allocation Category, "**TL One-Time Allocation**". When scheduling funds, schools should select the program name "**Robin Hood**" from the dropdown list.
