

SUMMARY OF SCHOOL ALLOCATION MEMORANDUM NO. 64, FY08

GOLDEN APPLE AWARDS

Summary

This allocation funds cash prizes for schools that win the NYC Department of Sanitation Golden Apple Awards, which honor schools that conceive and complete exemplary projects demonstrating awareness and civic responsibility in waste prevention, reuse and recycling.

Purpose

One of the objectives of the Children First initiative is to help students have the knowledge and skills they need to be good citizens. Schools can teach and model good citizenship by participating in programs such as the Golden Apple Awards, which highlight the importance of recycling and environmental stewardship.

Restrictions on Funds

Funds must be expended by June 30, 2008.

Allocation Formula

The Department of Sanitation has awarded \$73,500 to 20 schools.
