SUBJECT: **LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY**

The City Council has allocated \$400,000 to fund the Law Enforcement Academy program. The purpose of the program is to provide opportunities for students who are interested in law, the legal process and law enforcement careers.

Students who are enrolled in the program will take academically rigorous law related courses, participate in ancillary programs that will enhance their classroom learning and participate in citywide applied learning activities. Teachers will receive professional development sessions that are facilitated by experts in the Police Science and legal fields.

School Allocations:

School allocations are based on the following factors:

- Schools must expend all funds by June 30, 2008.
- A teacher coordinator is assigned to the program and receives preparation time equal to .4 or 2 class periods.
- Schools will provide staff professional development for teachers, program and student activities that are directly related to the Law Enforcement industry.

Allocation Formula:

The allotment is based upon the following criteria:

- Number of students enrolled in the program
- The number of classes in each Academy
- Sequential/Interdisciplinary courses

In an effort to expand Law Enforcement Academies, increase access and equity, monies will be allocated centrally to offer professional development to those schools interested in implementing a Law Enforcement Academy.
